Nativa P. Wood is a freelance court reporter from Mechanicsburg, PA. She was an official reporter with the Dauphin County Court of Common Pleas, Harrisburg, PA., for 35 years with the last 10 years as chief reporter. She has been involved with the Pennsylvania Court Reporters Association since 1983 and was president from 1990 to 1992. Tiva has also been the chair of NCRF, Council of the Academy of Professional Reporters, and the Committee on Professional Ethics. She is also a proud member of the Foundation's Legacy Society.

World Record:

In 2004, at the NCRA national convention, Mark wrote and transcribed a one-minute, 360 wpm Q&A at 97.23% accuracy, setting a new Guinness world record.

Recent Activity:

Has conducted dozens of seminars - in person, via telephone, and via internet - attended by thousands of court reporters all over North America on how to excel in court reporting speed and realtime.

In 2008, Mark founded Magnum Steno, Inc., to provide other products and services helpful to the court reporting/captioning profession. He published Magnum Steno: Write Short - Write Fast! his compendium of writing short for professional reporters, unveiled the Magnum Steno Club, a popular and fast-growing online club for daily practice of speed, briefs, as well as instructional videos. He is the author of My System: The Road to Realtime Excellence, published by the NCRA in 2001.

Mark is currently mentoring numerous court reporting students. He is the author of the Stenomaster theory published in 2004.

Maj. Steven "Chewy" Augugliaro

After graduating HS in 1995, Chewy joined the Hawaii Air National Guard and went to Basic, and Technical training to be an Avionics Technician on the C-130. Chewy was a part-timer in the Hawaii Air Guard during his 5 years as a mechanic, and attended Leeward Community College, and then transferred to Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University where he completed his Bachelor's in Professional Aeronautics in 1998, a little over two years after starting college. In October of 1998 Chewy applied, interviewed, and was awarded a spot to be an F-15 pilot with the Hawaii Air National Guard. He went to officer school and AF pilot training in 2000.

After almost two years of intense and challenging training on the mainland, Chewy returned to Hawaii as the newest F-15 pilot for the Hawaii Air Guard in November, 2002. Over the next 10 years, Chewy has flown the F-15 all over the mainland and the world, as far northeast as Iceland, as far west as Singapore, and as far south as Australia. He participated in numerous exercises, including every RIMPAC since 2004. He also sat Air Sovereignty Alert for the defense of the Hawaiian Islands, which is a 24/7 real-world mission. He was fortunate enough to have three F-15s with his name on it (not at the same time). Two of them ended their careers peacefully in the "Boneyard" in Tucson, AZ, and one sadly crashed in February 2008, remaining at the bottom of the ocean about 50 miles south of Honolulu (Chewy was not flying when it crashed!).

In September 2012, Chewy flew his "Fini-Flight" in the F-15 and then transitioned with the rest of the squadron to the Air Force's newest toy, the F-22 Raptor. In the short time Chewy has flown the F-22, he has flown training exercises in Panama City, FL; Las Vegas, NV; Penang, Malaysia, Guam, and numerous Sentry Aloha and RIMPAC exercises in Hawaii. In January 2016, Chewy was deployed to Southwest Asia to fly combat missions in support of the Global War on Terror.



Judge Jeannette Castagnetti

Judge Jeannette H. Castagnetti was sworn in as a First Circuit Court Judge on September 30, 2010. She is currently Deputy Chief Judge for the Civil Division and Arbitration Judge and the Senior Environmental Court Judge for the First Circuit. Her prior assignments included the civil trials division (presiding over jury and non-jury trials, settlement conferences, hearings on pretrial motions, including discovery disputes and dispositive motions) and the criminal division (presiding over adult domestic violence misdemeanor criminal jury trials). Recently she was a speaker for the IUCN (International Union for Conservation of Nature) World Conservation Congress convention held in Honolulu, Hawaii.

Prior to her appointment, Judge Castagnetti was a partner at Bronster Hoshibata (now known as Bronster Fujichaku Robbins) in Honolulu where she represented plaintiffs and defendants in state and federal courts in a variety of civil cases, including trust disputes, complex commercial matters, and employment discrimination claims. While in private practice, she served as a *per diem* judge in the District Court of the First Circuit from 2007 to 2010 and as special counsel for the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, Insurance Fraud Division from 2006 to 2007. She began her legal career as a deputy prosecuting attorney for the City and County of Honolulu in 1999.

Judge Castagnetti earned her law degree from California Western School of Law in San Diego, California, and her Bachelor of Arts degree in political studies from Pitzer College in Claremont, California.

She is a member of the Hawaii State Trial Judges Association (serving as its president from November 2015 to November 2017), the American Inns of Court (James S. Burns Aloha Chapter), and the American Judicature Society.

Detective Christopher Duque

Christopher Duque is a 30-year veteran of the Honolulu Police Department and retired in February of 2007. While with HPD, he worked in the Uniform Patrol Division and the Narcotics/Vice Division. In 1985 he was promoted to Sergeant/Detective and was assigned to the Criminal Investigation Division and remained in that division until his retirement. His last assignment in CID was with the White Collar Crime Unit where he specialized in cybercrime investigations and computer forensics.

Detective Duque is considered and recognized as one of Hawaii's leading computer and Internet crimes investigators. He has conducted investigations in a wide assortment of criminal offenses. These include the trafficking of child pornography, identity theft, various forms of Internet fraud, hacking and network intrusion cases, harassing and threatening cases, and child exploitation cases.

In 1999 Detective Duque was instrumental in obtaining federal grant funding to form the Hawaii Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force (HICAC).

In 1999 Chris Duque investigated Hawaii's first documented Internet frauds in which personal information (names, date of births, social security numbers, etc.) were used to perpetrate the fraud. This was years before the existing Identity Theft statutes were created. The suspect was identified, arrested, prosecuted, and convicted. He is still incarcerated at this time serving a 10-year sentence.

In 2002 Detective Duque was recognized as Detective of the Year and was also nominated as Employee of the Year for the City and County of Honolulu. During the same year he was also awarded the title of "Top Cop" from various state and local organizations.

Detective Duque has provided training for other law enforcement personnel and agencies and has been an instructor for the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC) in Glynco, Georgia. He also has been instructor for training provided by the FBI, U.S. Customs Services, The National White Collar Crime Center, and SEARCH.

Detective Duque is a member of the [High Technology Crime Investigators Association](#) (HTCIA) and [High Tech Crime Consortium](#) (HTCC). He is also the current president of [InfraGard Honolulu Members Alliance](#).

He has recently presented at The Social Media in Law Enforcement Conferences held in Washington, D.C. and in Santa Monica, CA, a first of its kind conference dedicated to the use of social media by law enforcement as a tool for investigation and community policing.

Chris Duque is currently working for The Department of the Prosecuting Attorney (Honolulu) as their CyberCrimes Investigator but also still works in the private sector as a consultant and continues to provide community services in the form of presentations and workshops on topics of Internet safety and security.
